The New California Public Media ➔ Education Service Brings Educational Resources to Teachers and Students

KQED and the California County Superintendents Educational Services Association (CCSESA) have teamed up with public media stations across the state to provide free, high-quality educational services to all California students and teachers. The **California Public Media Education Service** is a new initiative that grew out of the At-Home Learning rapid response to the wave of COVID-19 school closures in spring 2020. This new service collects all of the free digital resources and online events offered by California public media in one easy-to-navigate place.

“These are unprecedented times,” says San Bernardino County superintendent and CCSESA president Ted Alejandre, “All of us are doing as much as we can to support all of our 6.2 million plus students in the state of California. It’s just a pleasure for us, the superintendents across our 58 counties, to partner with other collaborators to make sure that students get the support they need.”

The Service features resources for all educators serving children from 2 years old through 12th grade and includes professional development courses and webinars as well as classroom media and lesson plans for use with students.

“Only public media could do this,” says Jamie Annunzio Myers, Chief Operating Officer at PBS SoCal. “We put together a one-stop shop that can serve teachers, families and students across the state.”

Our Body Politic Presents News by and for Black Women and Women of Color

In a political media landscape dominated by white men, *Our Body Politic*, an audio series hosted by award-winning journalist Farai Chideya, offers a source of news by and for Black women and women of color. Presented by KQED, KPCC and KCRW, part of the California Regional News Hub collaboration of public media stations, *Our Body Politic* examines how Black women and women of color are influencing the current presidential race while chronicling how they're working to reframe and rebuild America and find higher ground to lead the country.

"This is our time to vote, to live and to thrive amid the chaos of America," says Chideya. "People are in such deep pain, but they're also filled with passion. Black women and women of color disproportionately do the unpaid civic labor of standing up for rights that benefit us all — full and fair voting rights, equitable housing policy and desegregation of workplaces. Women of color come from many different races, income brackets and cultural and religious background, as well as different political party affiliations. We are not an afterthought in politics, but a key driver of the future of this nation."

Each week, Chideya engages and features Black women and women of color from around the country, including prominent politicians, leading journalists and influential entertainers as well as "everyday experts" who will provide a window into what's happening in their lives, regions and states. Tune in to *Our Body Politic* on Saturdays at 6pm on KQED Public Radio 88.5 FM, or listen to the podcast version wherever you get your podcasts.

STARTER EPISODE "ZONING OUT"

SOLD OUT: Rethinking Housing in America is a new limited-run KQED podcast series that looks at solutions to the country's housing crisis. In "Zoning Out," we take a deep dive into something many of us take for granted: the origins of single-family neighborhoods. It's a critical look at how the policies we put in place nearly a century ago helped reinforce the racial segregation we still see in our neighborhoods today. And you'll never guess which city was the first to do it.



STARTER EPISODE "WHAT'S LOVE (STYLES) GOT TO DO WITH IT"

The Uncertain Hour dives into one controversial topic each season. In this episode, Marketplace host Krissy Clark takes a government program we've all heard of — welfare — and shows us how little we actually know about it. It's a series that's best heard in order, but if you only listen to one episode make it this one.



STARTER EPISODE "I WILL ALWAYS LEAVE YOU"

The rock star team at *Radiolab*, which weaves deep-dive journalism with innovative sound design, looks at Dolly Parton's America in "I will always leave you." This is an unvarnished look at Parton, one of the most polished women in America. If you aren't already a fan, you'll gain a newfound respect for the country icon. And for the die-hard fans out there, this is a must-listen.

DID YOU KNOW?

Speaking of politics (this time closer to home), did you know:

- Prop 18 asks if 17-year-olds should be allowed to vote in primaries if they turn 18 by Election Day. Eighteen other states and the District of Columbia already allow this.
- Two props this year involve property taxes. Both hearken back to 1978's Prop 13, which put limits on how much property tax homeowners pay. Some call Prop 13 the "third rail" in California politics — something no politician can touch.
- In 2001, President George W. Bush banned federal funding for stem cell research. Californians then passed a \$3 billion bond measure to support the research in 2004. This year, voters will weigh in on whether to re-up that funding.

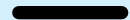

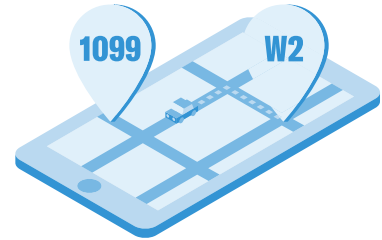
